Hebrews 10:24-25, "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching."






LUMC Extension Ministry to the Army Reserves

March Council Meeting Notes

After approval of the consent agenda, Rob Brooks led discussion on action item updates.

Building and Grounds – Johnny Fleet gave updates regarding the flooding and leaks and says the issue seems to be resolved, but he will keep an eye on it during the next rainstorms. The gutters are stopped up and he is trying to find someone to clean them out.

SPPR and Preschool Committee – There was discussion regarding the Preschool's request for full time employees to participate in a group health insurance plan. Stan Coloff has reviewed information on the plans offered by the conference. He asked if the preschool employees are considered church lay employees. Kelly Walden will be consulted regarding the cost and source of funding. It was also suggested that Kelly investigate whether there are any preschool groups or associations that may offer group health insurance plans.

Planning Retreat – An April date was originally discussed for a planning retreat that Rosabeth Ward and Tim Earnhardt will be organizing, but a date will have to be set in May instead.

New Business: Kristie Brookshire made a request to move 10,000.00 from the Building Fund investment account to our Operating Fund which is currently too low to meet expenses. She explained that after the investment account was established in December of 2022, nearly 94,000.00 was moved from the Operating Fund in the checking account to the Building Fund investment account in order to earn a higher rate of interest. The Operating Fund is Tithes and Offerings – not funds designated to the Building Fund. Donna made a motion to move 10,000.00 from the investment account to the Operating Fund. Stan seconded the motion which was approved.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Yosub thanked everyone for their support and prayers during his training to be an Army Reserve Chaplain. Elizabeth Johnson has resigned from her leadership positions of Recording Secretary, Annual Conference Delegate and Outreach Ministries. Due to current financial circumstances, Pastor Yosub checked with the Conference to determine the least amount of apportionments that can be paid. They advised to pay as much as the church is able. The Finance Committee will meet in the near future to determine what monthly amount will be paid.

The next Church Council meeting will be on **Tuesday, April 2, 2024**, **at 6:00 p.m.**


